CLAIMANT NOTICE OF TELEPHONIC FACT-FINDING INTERVIEW

A telephone fact-finding interview may be conducted by a Deputy of the Virginia Employment Commission in connection with your unemployment insurance benefits on

The following issue(s) has been raised concerning your eligibility for unemployment compensation:

Issues such as pension, vacation, severance, holiday pay, etc. that may affect your entitlement to unemployment benefits may be discussed during this hearing.

THE EMPLOYER MAY PARTICIPATE IN THE INTERVIEW

It is important that you carefully read the instructions listed below before beginning the telephone proceeding. You have the right to legal representation and to provide witnesses. If you are unable to take part in the proceeding as scheduled, you should submit a detailed written statement of the events resulting in the separation for consideration in making a determination in this matter. That statement, along with any other written documentation and witness statements you wish to have considered, must be received two (2) business days (not including state or federal holidays) prior to the scheduled interview date.

ADDRESS OF DEPUTY:

Failure to participate in this interview will result in a decision being issued based on the best available information.

PROCEDURES FOR THE PROCEEDING

The deputy will call you at the scheduled time so please be sure your line is free. If you do not answer your phone for any reason, including being unavailable when called or failing to remove blocks placed on your phone for "unknown callers", you will lose your opportunity to participate.

Once the proceeding begins each party will have the opportunity to speak, present its case fully, address all information presented by the other party, and pose relevant questions for other participants. It is important to:

1. Identify yourself before speaking and speak clearly and slowly.
2. Do not interrupt the speaker. You will have the opportunity for rebuttal to pertinent disputed statements.
3. If, at any time during the proceeding, you have difficulty hearing the conversation, notify the Deputy immediately.
4. If you lose the connection, hang up and wait for the Deputy to call you again to continue the proceeding.
