- **Laws and Regulations**: The Virginia <u>laws and regulations</u> pertaining to the practice of optometry are available for review.
- **Law related to written evidence requirement**: The Code of Virginia is amended effective July 1, 2018, to require written evidence of a didactic and clinical training course that includes training in administration of TPAs by injection prior to administering TPAs by injection. The <u>legislation</u> available for review.
- > Written evidence submission: Written evidence may be submitted to the Board via email, fax or postal carrier directly from the source. Written evidence must be adequate for the Board to determine that the TPA-certified optometrist has completed a didactic and clinical training course provided by an accredited school or college of optometry that includes training in administration of TPAs by injection. A sample attestation form is provided below that may be used, but is not required.
- **Fee:** There are no fees associated with submission of the required written evidence.
- **Board Communication:** The Board will notify the licensee via email when the written evidence has been received.
