 TATTOO APPRENTICESHIP COMPLETION FORM**

Upon completion of the Apprenticeship training, the sponsor shall review the apprentice's progress record for the training period. If the results of this review indicate the apprentice is now a candidate for the Board's examination, the sponsor shall complete and sign this form. The properly signed form should be submitted with the ***Tattooer License and Examination Application*** to the exam vendor listed above.

Completion of the apprenticeship program shall qualify the apprentice to apply the Board to take the Board for Barbers and Cosmetology tattooer license examination.

Curriculum requirements specified in 18VAC 41-50-200 of the Virginia Board for Barbers and Cosmetology Tattooing Regulations shall be taught over a minimum of 1500 hours broken down into the following categories:
