Some vehicles rejected from testing may need repairs to prepare the vehicle to receive an emissions inspection. If a vehicle has already failed the inspection it must either pass a re-inspection, or qualify for a waiver before it can be registered with DMV. Please be advised that any vehicle must complete the following requirements to qualify for a Vehicle Emissions Inspection WAIVER: 1. The vehicle must fail an initial emissions inspection. (Rejection from testing is not a failure) 2. REPAIR WORK MUST BE PERFORMED AT A VIRGINIA CERTIFIED EMISSIONS REPAIR FACILITY, AND THE REPAIRS MUST BE PERFORMED BY OR UNDER THE SUPERVISION OR APPROVAL OF A VIRGINIA CERTIFIED EMISSIONS REPAIR TECHNICIAN. 3. Emissions related repair expenditures must be at least the amount stated on a failed inspection report. 4. The Emissions Related Repair Data form(s) and copies of repair receipts must be provided to the inspection station. The vehicle must fail the re-inspection to qualify for a waiver. 5. Repairs must be performed no earlier than 60 days prior to the initial inspection. 6. A WAIVER WILL NOT BE GRANTED FOR: a) an OBD or Pre-test evaluation rejection from testing; b) a Tailpipe Emissions Inspection or OBD System failure for any vehicle with less than 24,000 miles that is less than two years old and is covered by an emissions warranty; c) an Emissions Control Systems Inspection failure on a 1973 or newer vehicle; d) a Visible Smoke Inspection failure for any vehicle.
